**The Position:** UCN is seeking an individual for a challenging and diverse position as an Instructor within the Faculty of Health for the DPN and Health Care Aide programs who is committed to excellence in teaching and an interdisciplinary approach to care. The position will involve teaching skills in a laboratory setting, evaluating the students' ability to apply theory to practice and supervising all clinicals. The instructor will facilitate learning experiences in both facility and community clinical settings. In addition to clinical teaching and instructional duties, the instructor will be responsible for student advising, maintenance of student records/grades, and other administrative tasks. The Instructor will also assist with assigned activities including University College promotion, student recruitment, and various program administrative functions.

### Qualifications:

- Registered Nurse with an Undergraduate or Graduate Nursing Degree preferred
- An active CRNM membership without restrictions
- A minimum of five years of work experience in nursing is essential
- A varied past experience including medical-surgical, Community Health, Gerontology, and/or Palliative Care, Mental Health and Northern Nursing
- Familiarity with curriculum development and delivery
- Effective interpersonal skills
- Effective communication skills
- Effective organizational skills
- Strong critical thinking and problem-solving skills
- Strong computer skills (Microsoft Office)
- Demonstrated ability to understand and to deal with cultural influences and issues specific to Indigenous learners and mature students in northern communities
- Personal experience and/or knowledge and understanding of the Indigenous cultures

- The ability to speak an Indigenous language
- Previous instructional experience

### Conditions of Employment:

- Candidates must be legally entitled to work in Canada
- Candidates must be willing to travel and possess a valid driver's license
- Must complete a Criminal Record Check, Child Abuse and Adult Abuse Registry Check
- Must have a current CPR Certificate
- Must agree to work 12 hour shifts with students if required due to clinical constraints

Applicants must provide a cover letter, résumé and references.

Applicants must demonstrate on their résumé how they meet the qualifications.
