University College of the North (UCN) is committed to building a workforce that is representative of the populations we serve. Applications are invited from individuals who have a demonstrated interest and ability to work with Indigenous learners and mature students.

The Position: This position involves teaching core Aboriginal and Northern Studies courses for student in the B. Ed program, in communities and on-campus. Consideration may be made for other disciplines (History) with a focus on Indigenous issues. This position will also include mentoring students; liaising with Indigenous communities and organizations; and participating in other program functions. The successful candidates will demonstrate excellence in teaching and scholarship. Instruction may occur in the evenings and on weekends. Instructors are responsible for related duties including classroom management, student supervision, maintenance of student records and grades, curriculum refinement and other administrative tasks. Travel to northern communities is expected.

Qualifications:

- A Doctorate in Aboriginal or Native Studies (cultural studies, Indigenous history, Indigenous perspectives on land-based methods) to be considered for the Assistant or Associate professor; applicants with Master's degrees in Arts with a specialization in Aboriginal or Native Studies and significant relevant experience may be considered for an Instructor classification
- Must have demonstrated creative and culturally-relevant instructional practices within an Indigenous perspective; ability to learn from and work with Elders and traditional knowledge-keepers
- Effective management and organizational skills
- Effective problem solving and analytical skills
- Effective communication skills (both oral and written)
- Crucial to this position is a demonstrated ability to understand cultural influences and issues specific to adult learners in northern communities
- Personal experience and/or knowledge and understanding of Indigenous cultures

Assets:

- A valid permanent Manitoba Teaching Certificate (or equivalent from another jurisdiction)
- Experience with a post-secondary teacher education program
- Use of current learning technologies in course delivery
- The ability to speak an Indigenous language
- Demonstrated record of research
- Familiarity with Indigenous cultural ceremony

Conditions of Employment:

- Candidates must be legally entitled to work in Canada
- Regular travel to remote communities, often by road, is required

Applicants must provide a cover letter, résumé, references and copies of their transcripts with their application.

Applicants must demonstrate on their résumé how they meet the qualifications.

Representative Workforce (formerly employment equity) is a factor in the selection process. Preference will be given to Indigenous candidates. Applicants are invited to indicate in their covering letter or résumé if they are from any of the following groups: Indigenous people, persons with disabilities, visible minorities, or women and men in non-traditional roles. All qualified candidates are encouraged to apply; however, Canadians and permanent residents will be given priority.
